Robert Kasprzak is the Manager of Prevention, Early Intervention, & School Based Services and the Crisis Intervention Team for the Mental Health and Recovery Services Board of Lucas County. As one of his duties, he managed the 2008 Lucas County Youth Survey, a comprehensive report of alcohol, tobacco, other drug, and mental health prevalence rates for students in grades 5 through 12. He has more than 14 years worth of experience in non-profit management starting as an Assistant Director at the largest homeless shelter for children in Ohio. Previous to this position Robert was in charge of a federal grant for the prevention of methamphetamine and inhalant abuse in six counties in northwest Ohio. He is a member of the State of Ohio's New & Immerging Drug Trends Committee, which successfully helped pass legislation limiting the amount of pseudoephedrine one person can purchase in a 24 hour period. He also worked with teen leaders in Lucas County to reduce the access to volatile inhalants. His efforts resulted in two national retail chains restricting the sale of hazardous items across the United States. Robert lives in Monroe, Michigan and is the past Co-Chair of the Monroe County Substance Abuse Coalition.
